From Dianne's Desk

LIVING INTO RESURRECTION

Congregations need to die so that they can be resurrected to new life—a life created not by the leaders, or by some magic formula, but rather by the miracle-working power of God, who knows the way out of the tomb.

A powerful, exciting change happened in January at the Crown Heights Planning Meeting for 2010. Rather than mourning the drop in worship and Sunday School attendance or our financial struggles, all of which can lead to death, our leaders came out of worship with a brave, new concept: **What if we looked at ourselves as a new church start?** Every new church needs a core group of dedicated people who are committed to getting the fledgling congregation off the ground. What if we were that core group? With this new paradigm shift came a flurry of creative ideas:

- ❖ We are beginning to have more couples in their twenties and thirties. How can we help them develop friendships?
- ❖ Members of new churches are especially enthusiastic about sharing their experiences with others. How can we help one another be more intentional about sharing our story and inviting others to visit Crown Heights? We could have “Friendship Sundays” frequently, so we have a goal to work toward. Valentine’s Day is coming up February 14th. It will be our first “Friendship Sunday” and we’ll encourage everyone to bring a friend.
- ❖ What kinds of activities, beyond Sunday morning, would be easy times for new people to visit? We want more fun times like going to the RedHawks game.
- ❖ What if we claimed our parking lot space for ministry, by putting up a sign, installing a basketball hoop for the neighborhood kids, and even putting up a free hot dog stand on St. Patrick’s Day to feed the “Cock on the Walk” patrons?
- ❖ Our building is located in a historic preservation district. What if we had an Open House so folks from the area could see our beautiful sanctuary? How about a “Grand Opening”

on the first Sunday in March, complete with balloons and building tours and refreshments?

- ❖ What if we worshipped together in one service several times a year, so that people could get better acquainted? How about doing that on Palm-Passion Sunday at 10:00, so everyone could see the children waving their palms and enjoy the special music, followed by a potluck brunch at 11:00?
- ❖ New churches bend over backwards to be welcoming to their guests—wearing name tags, being sure that everyone is greeted, making an effort to learn their names. We’re doing better on being welcoming, but we could still do more. What if everyone greeted a guest before greeting their friends after worship?
- ❖ A new church would be thrilled to be given a building as large and beautiful as ours, debt-free. All we have to do is pay the utilities, tend to the maintenance needs and spruce things up here and there. What if we saw our building as an asset, rather than a liability? We still need to address the handicapped accessibility issues and we need better signs so people can find their way around, but this is a good location and a great, historic space.

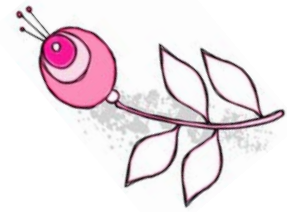
