Following God's Lead

Do you have a list of special places that you'd like to visit before you die? What's on your "bucket list"? My list of places I'd love to see is fairly long, and I'm beginning to notice that I'm getting really close to the final third of my life! I may never have the resources and time to travel to all of them. Four of those destinations fit in the "spiritual pilgrimages" category. I want to visit the Holy Land, including some sites in Turkey and Egypt as well. I long to visit the island of Iona and other sites that gave birth to Celtic Christianity. I do dream of visiting the Chartres Cathedral in France and walking the ancient labyrinth that is preserved in their floor. And I would really like to do the "Wesley Tour" of the key places in England that shaped John Wesley, who turned out to be the founder of Methodism.

I may never be able to go in person, but I'm delighted to tell you about the special study we are beginning this Sunday, April 3rd, at 9:50 am in the parlor. Rev. Adam Hamilton, the senior pastor of the very large United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City, has gotten to do the Wesley tour at a leisurely pace. He took with him his own camera crew and used the different buildings and locations as the starting points for six chapters in his book, Revival: Faith as Wesley Lived It. Each week we'll see a DVD that shows us the sites and helps us grow in our knowledge and understanding of John Wesley. He was an amazing man, though not without his faults. His sermons are hard to read, given the differences in English from his time to ours, but he also kept daily journals, wrote a number of books and wrote lots of letters. In these writings we have windows into his faith, his worries, and his strong opinions. In the early days he tended to be too critical of the practices and scripture interpretations of others, leading to the point where he was no longer allowed to preach in Anglican churches in England. That's when he started preaching outdoors, eventually drawing huge crowds. His ministry took many forms-teaching students at Oxford, setting up a small group system to help new Christians grow in their faith, visiting regularly in the prisons, setting up Sunday Schools so children could learn to read, setting up medical clinics where he could, and feeding the poor. His understanding of the gospel continued to widen and deepen throughout his lifetime. He was exceptionally well-educated for his time, but he learned how to communicate with people who had no formal education-coal miners, debtors, people living on the streets. Somehow God was able to use this stuffy Anglican priest to move the church out of buildings, into the New World, out into the rural areas and into the heart of London. He trained his own cadre of lay preachers who went from place to place, sharing the good news of Christ, both in America and England. Thanks to his devotion to prayer at 4:00 am every day, his receiving communion as often as possible, and his constant love for learning while helping the poor, John Wesley managed to come up with the "Middle Way." He was gifted at building bridges between different theological approaches, combining head and heart, explaining basic theology, and being sure to balance his love and hunger for God with his determined approaches to improving the society of his day.
