Thoughts from Trina

WE ARE CALLED... AND CALLED AGAIN.

When Mother Teresa was 17, she felt called to be a nun, a total commitment of her life. She joined the Loreto order with missions in India and served as the principal of St Mary's school in Calcutta. One September day when she was 36, Mother Teresa felt a call again; she described it as a "call within a call." This time she felt called to devote her life to help the poor in Calcutta. Mother Teresa lived the rest of her life true to these two calls.

God calls each of us to first follow, then calls us to live out our faith in a specific way.

I imagine most of us reading this article have experienced our first call. We have felt God's tug on our hearts, calling us to follow Christ. This is a very Methodist understanding of grace called prevenient grace. It's the grace that comes first, that God reaches out to us before we even know God.

I was baptized as an infant. I grew up in the United Methodist Church. I felt God's love in my life as a child. I remember being in elementary school, memorizing the Lord's Prayer. Even in high school, I turned to God in my struggles, as dramatically told in my journals! Now it's that second call that is our life's work. Mother Teresa's "call within a call" gave her life a focus that she remained true to until her dying day. I think Methodists would call this sanctifying grace. That is the grace that works on us throughout our Christian journey, more and more aligning us with God. But I like Mother's Teresa's language saying she felt called and called again.

For me, I felt a second call to ordained ministry. I am drawn to serve God through the church. I see the beauty of God's people gathering for worship and service as irresistible. I also see my calling as helping others identify their callings and live into those callings most fully.

How has God called you to live out our faith?

God calls us into relationship and then into service. Let us be true to the voice of God!

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE by Elizabeth

Progress continues on our new tile roof, though last month's stormy weather did slow us down. May saw the completion of tile removal and the start of work installing our new copper flashing and lightning protection system.

No longer will CHUMC be protected from fire by a single lightning rod up the steeple. (Inspection upon removal revealed it had been hit dozens of times!) The new system protects all our buildings with copper air terminals (18" spikes) placed strategically around our rooflines and interconnected to distribute any lightning strikes to the ground through 14 different ground rods.

Our new steeple was constructed to match the old one, only without all the dents and damage! It is clad in copper that will patina naturally over time like the original steeple did, and retains the original finial (which served as the original lightning rod). It also has a steel

frame which should make it lighter, stronger and more weather-resistant over time. The lightning protection cables will now run inside the steeple, instead of being visible outside and across the roof.

We expect installation of the new tile to begin in June, so please respect the safety perimeters indicated by cones and caution tape. There will continue to be a danger of falling objects for as long as roof work continues, regardless of



whether or not workers are present above. The scaffolding at the south sanctuary door and the

office entrance to the Youth Activities Building should make access from 37th Street easier. The 37th Street porch and Draper Garden are still off-limits, and only minimal areas of the back yard are accessible (mostly the garage, sidewalk and back porch). Additionally, tempting as it may be, please do not use the roofers' dumpster.

Thanks for your continued tolerance for the inconveniences that naturally accompany building improvements. The interior leaks have already been halved, and weather permitting, we should see a lot of exterior progress in June.
