"I AM" SERMON SERIES

Through the Month of May

Years ago, Mohamed Ali, the boxer, would say, "I am the greatest." He was an amazing boxer, and he wanted to be seen as exactly that. He wanted to impress and be lifted up in society.

But the one we worship is Jesus the Christ, who would never have said, "I am the greatest." He was worshipped because those around him saw his abilities and divine connection. The followers of Jesus understood him as the greatest without him having to declare it.

Instead Jesus described himself in very relatable ways. He said, "I am the Bread of Life" and "I am the Good Shepherd." And he said, "I am the Light of the World" and "I am the Vine and you are the Branches." He spoke in metaphors to help us understand him.

There are 7 "I am" statements spoken by Jesus in the Gospel of John. Each are rooted in the stuff of everyday life. For all the seekers, trying to find God in their lives, Jesus says I am right here with you. This is the same Jesus who made sacramental the waters of baptism and the bread and wine of communion.

These "I am" passages in John call us to find Jesus in our real lives, in our work and in our homes. Jesus says, "I am Way, the Truth, and the Life," so may we find our way to live closer to Christ.
