Also, the building will be closed. We ask for no one to enter so we can keep the space safe and available for the staff.

We are all practicing social distancing. If you need something at the church, call Susan or Trina. We will help you get it.

The church is not the building


I have heard it said, the church is not the building. It's such a nice statement about the body of Christ we are more than the building; what's essential is the community that gathers in God's name.

Mobile Meals Update

Our church has a 20+ year history of serving Mobile Meals to homebound members of our community, and they hardly missed a Monday delivery. But on March 15, Charlene and Mary cooked up one last hot meal before we canceled meals for a month. We feel cooking and delivering meals put too many people at risk—recipients and us. On March 23, we delivered four frozen meals to each client to get them through the month.

We are so grateful to the church for stepping in purchasing the 80 frozen meals (4 each for our 20 clients). Our excellent shoppers provided meals, plus fruit, cookies, and toilet paper. You guys to really wonderful! Thank you!



On April 20, we will deliver another month's supply of meals. Your great shopping has supplied us the meals with need. We have people committed to baking cookies and shopping for frozen veggie bags.

Finance Update

Two weeks ago, the biggest issue facing the Finance Committee was whether to replace or repair the church sign on the corner of NW 37th and Western. Since the arrival of COVID-19, our focus has shifted to a more important issue—how to keep our church operational until this crisis ends. Unfortunately, even though the church is no longer available for group worship, we are still obligated to pay the regular monthly bills that go along with running the church. Other than insurance, utilities, and other items that have to be paid, we also have payroll to consider. Crown Heights is extremely fortunate to have a wonderful minister and incredible staff. Most of the staff rely on these wages to support themselves and their families. The Finance Committee has pledged to do everything possible to continue paying them as usual until things get back to normal. However, if the money is not there, the church won't be in a position to pay those individuals.

In a typical month, Crown Heights receives around \$17,000 in pledged and non-pledged giving from church members and visitors. A significant portion of this money is collected on Sunday mornings when the plates are passed throughout the congregation during church service. Without any weekly church services in the foreseeable future, there is obvious concern that the church won't have this income available to pay bills and church payroll. The Ministry Resource Team and Finance Committee have taken steps to avoid or minimize the expenses and payments that are not absolutely necessary. However, we are still concerned that the income needed for necessary expenses will not be available. We realize and understand that many of us have been financially impacted by this crisis and can't give as much as we would like. However, for those of you who are able to give, please attempt to keep your pledges and giving current during this time. One way you can do this easily is to make an on-line donation through Crown Heights' website (http://crownheightsumc.org/). For those who are not technologically savvy, you are always welcome to send a check to the church in the mail. (Crown Heights UMC, 1021 NW 37th Street, OKC 73118)

We don't know how long this crisis will last, but with God's guidance and reassurance I am confident Crown Heights UMC will survive and be ready to once again focus on doing God's work when things return to normal. On behalf of the Finance Committee, I want to thank you for your loyalty and devotion to Crown Heights UMC. Please take care of yourself, follow the CDC's advice, and know we look forward to seeing you all soon.
