#### **COVID-19 Guidelines**

As our state COVID numbers reach their highest levels, we are operating with more caution than even in the past few weeks.

For **worship** on Sunday, we will Facebook Livestream worship from the Sanctuary at 9:30am. Being inside has more risks than being outside, so Outdoor Worship service at 11am is recommended for those who would like to attend in person worship. If you would like to be in the Sanctuary at 9:30, we will spread out and be diligent with our precautions, keeping numbers under 15.

We are following recommendations by the CDC and the OK United Methodist Conference. The main guidelines we are to follow are:

- Masks are required.
- Stay distanced. Family units will be seated at least six feet apart. In the Sanctuary, if you would like a safer place to sit, the 3 balconies are available (seating clearly marked).
- Our church will continue to offer options to gather outside and virtually.
- If you develop COVID-19 symptoms or test positive in the days after attending worship, please let Trina or the church office know.

Their goal is to provide a warm bed and safety from the elements for those experiencing homelessness for the night. And they know there will be people and families who come to hungry.

Our church's mission for this month is to help stock their freezer. Please **bring frozen meals** (store bought or homemade) to the church throughout the month. Meals can be for one person or for a family, anything is appreciated!



#### **Finance Update**

The Finance Committee is in the final stage of collecting 2021 pledge cards from our members. Thanks to all those who have returned their cards. The pledge campaign results



allow the Finance Committee to forecast next year's budget. With it, we have are better able to anticipate what programs and expenses we will be able to afford in the coming year. If you haven't returned your pledge card, please send it to the Church as soon as possible. You can also call or email Susan at Church and confirm your 2021 pledge.

As we move to the last few months of 2020, I am happy to report that it appears we have been financially able to overcome multiple crises this year including a pandemic, a \$35,000 air conditioning expense, a bee invasion, and extensive damage from an ice storm. In spite of these catastrophes, pledged income is at 93.8% of the budgeted amount and our overall income is actually at 106.5% of the budget. We have already been able to pay more of our Conference Apportionments than we paid in all of 2019. We are operating at an \$11,972.51 profit, when last year at this time we had a \$4700 loss.

The Church could not have made it through 2020 without the dedication and support of its members. The Finance Committee would like to thank everyone for all they have done to support the Church through this last year.
