### CROWN HEIGHTS UMC CARES



Our church has been committed to helping settle refugees from Afghanistan since late September. We have furnished two apartments and are assigned our third family (a family of seven). For this apartment, First Presbyterian Church is teaming up with us. They have purchased the mattresses for all the beds.

Catholic Charities has the hard job of finding affordable housing for all the refugees in our city. This piece has taken longer than anticipated. In the meantime, our church is actively looking for ways to help with other needs. We have delivered diapers and baby clothes to a pregnant woman. We gave a kitchen table to another family. We bought Afghan rugs and floor pillows for a family. We purchased a harmonium for a young man, who missed his old hobby (see picture above). We have been given the name of a family who need new shoes and will shop for them very soon.

Crown Heights UMC is still committed to helping our newest neighbors in this time of adjustment. Thank you, church, for supporting all the work we have done so far!

### MOBILE MEALS HELP

CHUMC provides approximately 16-20 meals every Monday to homebound seniors in our community through **Meals on Wheels of OKC.** We are in need of dedicated folks to lend a hand and keep this ministry going.


There are many ways to help this program:

## THANK YOU, JANET BASLER



Since Whiz Kids came to our church 20 years ago, Janet Basler has been our church's representative and leader. And 18 years ago, she began Arts Academy. These two programs are such important ministries in our church. Janet is retiring from her leadership roles in May, and our church owes her a big thank you!

Janet answered these questions below:



When and how did you find Crown Heights UMC?

We were members of a church that was falling apart, so we were looking for a church close to our house. We visited CHUMC in 1979. We came during the SS hour, and a man met us at the door to take us to the children's area. Dewey Beningfield showed us 'his church'. Really the way he so lovingly looked at it and spoke of it, it was his 'home' also. Then he took us to his SS class. but afterward everyone left and we were lost. We couldn't figure out how to find our kids! So we went outside, found the sanctuary, and sat in a pew. Another couple about our age came and sat in the same pew. At the end of the service, they introduced themselves (Steve and Carol Barrymore) and we found out they lived around the corner from our house, and had children about our kids' ages. When we picked up our kids, the teacher sent the girls home with a large aloe vera plant. She hadn't had enough plants for the girls to take home like the other kids since she hadn't planned on them, so she gave her own plant to them. I had burned myself very badly the day before and had been looking, without success, for an aloe vera plant. We joined Crown Heights shortly afterward.

#### How did Whiz Kids and Arts Academy start at our church?

Twenty years ago, our church was in the midst of a clergy change and decided to do a visioning weekend to help with that. Sixty + people showed up for the event. We reminisced about our past the first night. The next morning we read scripture and prayed. In the afternoon we were divided into groups to discuss what we had done. We had about eight groups. We spent several hours discussing in our small groups only and writing on those long papers people get during things like this. We were to write the vision we saw for our church in our discussion. In the evening we met with the whole group to hang our papers with the other groups'. Every single one of the groups put 'Reach out to the kids in the neighborhood' as their first thing. Most of other things written related to that also. After defining that more closely, we made it our vision for the future. It was so clear and unanimous, we didn't even meet the next day as planned. It took about a year for the new pastor to figure out how to approach that vision. The church secretary let me know that Whiz Kids had come to us to ask us to be a partnering church. I told the pastor I'd coordinate it. He said ok, and we became a WK church. Two years later one of our WK wanted to get into CSAS as an artist. We got her reading scores up to be accepted but had no way to help with an art portfolio. At the time I was the Key Club sponsor at CSAS. On a walk one evening, I believe God said to me, "You have kids who want to learn music/art, and kids who want to teach. Put them together." We did and the Arts Academy was born.

## What are you and Stan doing in your retirement?

We have figured out how to live in two homes in two states, OK and KS. But we are now getting tired of driving over 600 miles a week, and will be spending all but a few days a month on our farm in southeast Kansas. We love the starlight nights, the animals roaming around, the beautiful scenes outside our very large windows, and living simply with good friends around. Stan has been pastoring a church an hour away from our farm for the last three years. He has also become active in county politics, and he loves 'playing/working' as he rides his tractor as often as possible. I've been keeping up with my kids, grandkids, Whiz Kids, and Arts Kids while we are at the farm three days a week. I've been crocheting hats and scarves for the homeless, and helping cook and serve for the community meals the church does twice a month. While in OKC three days a week, I coordinate WK and AA and see grandkids.

#### What will you miss most about your OKC life?

Stan will miss preaching regularly at Redemption Church, and working at the Innocence Project in OKC, as well as his grandkids. I will greatly miss Whiz Kids and Arts Academy. I will miss my family here, though I'll see them monthly, it's just not the same as making every ballgame and party. I will miss spending time with my friends, though I plan to coordinate my grandkid visits with my church circle time to keep up with those friends. And we both will really miss several of our favorite restaurants.
