

LENT- GOOD ENOUGH BY REV TRINA BOSE NORTH It's been over a year since my friend Kerri W. recommended a podcast called *Everything Happens* with Kate Bowler. I quickly fell in love. Kate Bowler is a Duke Seminary professor, teaching at the intersection of culture and religion. At age 35, her understanding of God and faith drastically deepened when she was diagnosed with Stage IV cancer. Now Kate grasps the beauty found in being real. Her favorite subjects are pain, loss, endurance, and an appreciation of life based in honesty.

This Lent we will hone in on Kate Bowler's theology of "Good Enough," embracing the imperfections of life and faith. This season we will ponder how we can make more room for God in our lives and consider from what we might take a break (social media, Netflix, caffeine, unkind words, alcohol, or holding a grudge). All this is to get to our real focus— how can I give more of my authentic self over to God?

### Here is "A Blessing Before a Fast" by Kate Bowler.

Blessed are you, ready to open yourself to a new joy, a doorway that until now has been hidden. In this culture of acquisition and gain, blessed are you desiring fresh ears to hear what might be a bit too loud. Who take the next step to turn it down a notch and make more space for God. Who discipline yourself, with time, intention, and hope, anticipating God to show up in your discomfort. Trusting that when we need God, God promises to be there. God, give me courage, give me strength, give me hunger for you. Let this set time of less be a chance for more of you. Let this fast be an entrance into the discernment I desire, the divine presence I'm longing for, and the hope to will what You will, oh God, to be who You've called me to be.



### FINANCE UPDATE

### FEBRUARY - MARCH '23

The Finance Committee has now closed the books on 2022. For the first time in a number of years, Crown Heights finished the year with a loss on its income statement. This loss was due to various reasons including a decrease in pledge income, additional expenses incurred when our previous financial secretary resigned as well as decreased income from the Endowment Fund because of the downturn in the stock market. (We actually had more money available, but felt it would be more prudent to leave some of the available money in the Endowment until things returned to normal.)

Fortunately, even with the loss, we were able to pay 90% of our apportionments as well as more than 25% of our non-required apportionments. Furthermore, we were able to assist our members and others in the community in many ways including groceries, furniture and household items for Afghan refugees, care packages, diapers, and bus passes. We could not carry out these missions without you.

In the coming year, please remember all the good things that our church does and do your best to keep your pledge current. Any offering over your pledge would be welcome. If we had 100 people donate only \$5 a week over their pledge for apportionments, we would be able to pay the entire amount of our required apportionments, which are used to provide aid to people throughout our community, state, nation and world. I am going to try this myself. If you would like to make an additional donation for apportionments, please note that on the memo line of your check or on the envelope.

### **CHOIR ROOM**



We started redoing the Choir Room back in October and just finished up last week. Jim Rust coordinated the construction with a lot of help from church members, our youth, OU's Big Event, and Trina's boys. We reconfigured the storage cabinets-- what once held music sheets is now going to house church decor and tablecloths. The largest expense was new flooring (\$5,500).
