DO ALL THE GOOD YOU CAN

Give liberally and be ungrudging when you do so, for on this account the Lord your God will bless you in all your work and in all that you undertake. Since there will never cease to be some in need on the earth, I therefore command you, "Open your hand to the poor and needy neighbor in your land." – Deuteronomy 15:10-11

Our church is dedicated to embodying God's love to all people- *no ifs, ands, or buts!* So many in our state struggle with medical debt that holds them back from living the unencumbered life God desires for us. Our church is joining Kingfisher UMC to help abolish medical debt through our "Do All the Good You Can" campaign.

Beginning in June, we have the opportunity to help our neighbors in Western Oklahoma by giving money to buy medical debt through the non-profit RIP Medical Debt. RIP Medical Debt is a company that purchases debt from the secondary debt market and healthcare providers. We can get rid of 4.9 million dollars' worth of debt for \$27,000! Seriously, we can do a lot of good for pennies on the dollar.

You are welcome to give through the church by check or cash-labeled "medical debt." Our children will be collecting your spare change each Sunday in June (11am service). So come with our coins in hand! Let's see how much good we can do for others!

By the way, currently Oklahoma's total medial debt is over 8.4 million dollars' worth of debt and would cost approximately \$50,000 to abolish. If together we raise over what is needed for Western Oklahoma, we will simply keep buying debt to the east.

Crown Heights UMC is partnering with Kingfisher UMC and RIP Medical Debt to get rid of 4.9 million dollars' worth of debt in Western Oklahoma for \$27,000!

RIP Medical Debt purchases a portfolio of medical debt and then uses the money we raise to abolish the debt for individuals who meet at least one of the following two criteria. 1) Earn at or less than 4x the federal poverty level. 2) Have medical debts that are 5% or more of their annual income. If you want more information on RIP Medical Debt, feel free to check them out for yourself at ripmedicaldebt.org.





