THE CRUCIFIXION & RESURRECTION REV. TRINA BOSE NORTH SUNDAY SCHEDULE

Throughout Lent, we have been reading from the Gospel of John. John paints a distinction between the way of the world and the way of Christ. Our materially focused, self-absorbed, heartless world, when held up to God's realm, is exposed for the shallowness it is. Jesus' compassion and relationship to God are like nothing we have seen before. We can't help but recognize him as the Son of God, filling us with wonder.

As in the Healing of the Blind Man story (John 9), Jesus did not live within the bounds of our world. Not only did he heal the blind, he healed on the sabbath and wasn't interested in identifying the sin that caused the blindness. Everything we thought we knew is turned upside down with Jesus.

These stories serve to prepare us for the wonder of the crucifixion and resurrection. The cross was a common tool of the Roman government, yet when we see Jesus on the cross, we see the brutality of our ways. Our world is exposed for the what it really is. And we are left wanting to follow Jesus past the cross into New Life.

Rachel Held Evans wrote, "We could not become like God, so God became like us. God showed us how to heal instead of kill, how to mend instead of destroy, how to love instead of long for more. When we nailed God to a tree, God forgave. And when we buried God in the ground, God got up."

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Our church has been busy working on the improvements paid for through our Capital Campaign. Each project is truly important in maintaining our old building. Here's an update:

- 1. We replaced the 3 HVAC units on the Youth Activity roof and replaced the old ductwork. We still need the roofer to come out and waterproof the connections into the building. COST: \$96,000
- 2. The east exterior wall of the Sanctuary has been repaired. The mortar was repointed, and the whole wall was sealed. During Holy Week, they should be painting the interior of that wall. COST: \$11,000 We have worked out a plan to replace the lighting for the Sanctuary stained glass windows. ESTIMATED COST: \$5,000
- 3. The large oak tree in our backyard will come down next week. COST \$5,000
- 4. The Trustees moved forward on a repair (not replacement) bid on the parking lot on Western. We will be fixing the potholes and resurfacing next week. COST: \$25,000

This work puts our church in a position to look to the future and dream bigger about how to use our space for more ministry and revenue.

GENERAL CONFERENCE 2024

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church is coming up April 23 through May 3 in Charlotte, NC. United Methodists from across our denomination will meet for the first time since 2019, when the Traditional Plan was passed. With support from the African delegates, stricter penalties on clergy who officiate gay marriages were added, as well as an exit ramp was put in place for progressive churches to leave the denomination. But in these last 5 years, churches on the left stayed in the United Methodist Church and conservative incompatiblists left *en masse*.

This General Conference has a clear focus - to move our denomination past our prohibitions against gay marriage and gay ordination. There are three legislative goals from Reconciling Ministries Network and progressive delegates. I have heard it referred as the "3 R's" - Regionalization, Removal of Discriminatory Language from the Book of Discipline, and approving the Revised Social Principles.

Rev. Derrek Belase (Conference Director of Connectional Ministries) recommends, "The best place to get information on the General Conference and the various petitions is through the <u>United Methodist News Service</u> and *The Contact* (OK Conference newsletter). Our Communication and Council staff will be bringing live updates from the General Conference."

I am flying to Charlotte to observe the General Conference from April 28 through May 3. I will update our church as legislation is passed. Check our church's Facebook page.


