We worked with an unhoused couple to supplement initial rent to get them in housing (\$100 total).

Our church provided partial rent money to keep a man housed (\$80).

In honor of the women in our church, we donated \$250 to Skyline Urban Ministry.

We provided candy to all the staff & faculty at Putnam Heights Academy.

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

As Crown Heights heads into the summer vacation months, I am happy to announce that the church is doing well financially. We are close to breaking even and doing a good job staying within our budget. Although our non-pledged giving was less than we had hoped, our pledging members are 107% ahead of the amount we had anticipated at this point in the year in our budget. This is outstanding! We have paid \$4500.00 of the \$5138 we had budgeted for mandatory apportionments through April, but still have a long way to go. Remember, you are always welcome to make a special gift, over and above your pledge, directly to apportionments by noting that on the memo line of your check.

The Finance Committee would also like to thank our members for the unbelievable job they did surpassing our goal for the Capital Improvements Campaign. Thanks to your giving, the church is more beautiful and functional than ever. We already have a resurfaced parking lot (that was in dire need of repair), our heat and air units are working and the water damage in the front of the church has been repaired and painted. None of this could have been done without you.

#### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN NUMBERS

The Finance Committee wants to express its appreciation for our church congregation's support of the Capital Improvements Campaign, which raised funds to keep our church building and grounds operational, functional, and beautiful!

Together we raised \$164,000. For a church whose annual budget is about \$300,000, raising an additional \$164K is amazing. Special thanks to our neighboring businesses, who donated \$16,000.

This Spring we were able to renovate our building in some very important ways. Here is what we were able to accomplish:

- 1. We replaced 3 HVAC units for the Youth Activity building & replaced ductwork. Roofers waterproofed the connections into the building. COST: \$96,000
- 1. On the east exterior wall of the Sanctuary, the mortar was repointed and the wall was sealed. We painted the interior of that wall. COST: \$11,000 New lighting for the Sanctuary stained glass windows. COST: \$7,600
- 2. The large, backyard oak tree has come down. COST: \$5,000
- 3. We repaired (not replaced) the parking lot on Western. Potholes fixed. The whole lot is resurfaced. COST: \$28,000
- 4. We continue to work on the bathroom addition, just off the front of the Sanctuary. ESTIMATED COST: \$10,000

Recipients are encouraged to contribute up to 20% of the proceeds back to the Fund following college graduation IF they are financially able to do so. The Crown Heights United Methodist Church Endowment is excited to announce the awarding of the CLARENCE FORD SCHOLARSHIP this year to **Nathan North**.

He used this to help Julie repair a table in the children's area and has worked on several additional projects here at the church. Jim Rust stated that Nathan's desire to learn and willingness to be involved has been a huge help as Jim has worked with him on projects.

Nathan plans to attend Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology in Okmulgee to study construction management. We are excited to present this scholarship to Nathan! Congratulations!




