WORSHIP SERIES ON MOSES

REV. TRINA BOSE NORTH

Moses, the great prophet of the Old Testament, came from humble beginnings, but God led him to do amazing things. He freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt through the Red Sea. He led his grumbling people in the wilderness for 40 long years. Just before they crossed the Jordan River to enter the Promised Land, Moses died on Mount Nebo. He never actually stepped foot in the Promised Land.

Rev. Adam Hamilton calls Moses a "reluctant prophet." Moses started out a least-likely candidate for the job, but we witness his growth in character and in his relationship with God. Beginning August 11, Sunday School will study Adam Hamilton's book on this topic--Sunday School meets in the Parlor from 9:45-10:45am. Consider joining us for a weekly video and conversation.

Join us in worship each Sunday in August through November as we will be focus on Moses' stories told in the Books of Exodus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. This 17-week series will help us understand who Moses was and how his relationship with God carried a people through a difficult time. I think we will relate to the journey of the Israelites through the wilderness and be inspired by Moses' faithfulness.





YOUTH MISSION TRIP TO GOODWELL, PUBLISHED IN THE OK UMC CONTACT

Jennifer Lark grew up in the small town of Goodwell, OK, just 10 miles southwest of Guymon. Her dad was a professor at Panhandle State University, and her family attended Panhandle Centenary United Methodist Church in Goodwell her entire life. This is the church that taught her about God's love and what it meant to be a United Methodist. So as an adult in Oklahoma City, she made Crown Heights United Methodist Church her church home.

Over the past couple of years, Panhandle Centenary UMC had to decide to remain UMC or disaffiliate. Many of the churches in the Woodward District were choosing to leave because the UMC was about to permit gay weddings and gay people as clergy. The pastor of PCUMC was encouraging the church to leave. But as the church began to understand the issues, they wrote a letter to the bishop, saying they wanted to remain in the UMC. Member Sarah Strain Green said, "As the UMC persisted for LGBT inclusion, many churches left the UMC. We chose to stay. This tiny church in the middle of a conservative region decided that 'the greatest of these is love.'"

Since deciding to stay UMC, PCUMC has lost some of their members but found their identity. They want their church to be a welcoming place for everyone and since the nearest UM church to them is 62 miles away, they want to be the United Methodist presence in their area as part of the Elk City UM Hub.

Because of Jennifer Lark and her mom Sue's visits to OKC, the people of Crown Heights UMC began to care about and support this church in Goodwell. Crown Heights UMC is a Reconciling congregation and had an affinity for what Panhandle Centenary UMC was doing. When Sue Lark made trips to OKC, Rev. Trina Bose North (pastor of Crown Heights UMC) would bless the communion breads that would be used in worship in Goodwell.

The Crown Heights UMC's youth group decided to drive out to Goodwell for a mission trip from July 11 to July 13. They wanted to serve and show up for this sister church. These city kids got to experience small town life, like exploring a corn field at 10pm. The church hosted the youth group to perfection. The youth stayed in their empty parsonage, and the church cooked all their meals. And the youth returned the favor by painting the exterior steps leading into the sanctuary.

On Friday evening, the youth drove to all the members' homes to leave pink flamingos in their yards. They taped a sign to each front doors saying, "Birds of a feather."

By the time this mission trip ended, both churches felt the love. Crown Heights UMC and Panhandle Centenary UMC found they have much in common, including a love for each other and a mutual prayer for each church's ministry of being God's loving presence in the world.



WHIZ KIDS READING PROGRAM

For the 22nd year, Thursday afternoons at Crown Heights will once again be rocking this fall with the sounds of happy elementary school kids reading, enjoying a snack, playing games, and learning about their community on one of our many field trips. We will be one of 34 sites across the Oklahoma City area to provide tutoring for elementary school kids from our local public elementary schools. Last year, every one of our Whiz Kids raised their reading testing scores, some even jumping grade levels. While their dedicated teachers at Wilson deserve the credit for those raised scores, we know our safe, structured program every Thursday afternoon with tutors who show kindness, love and patience with the kids is making a positive difference in the lives of the kids.

Trina's sermons often emphasize performing small acts with great love is what makes the difference in our lives and the lives of our loved ones. Being a Whiz Kid tutor is one of the best ways I know of where you can do just that, and you don't have to be a retired educator or rocket scientist to qualify. All you need is the desire to help a great kid improve their reading skills and boost their confidence and self-esteem. As a new tutor, you will find that we have accumulated plentiful resources including books and games and a support system of experienced tutors and leaders who are always onsite to help. You will find that tutoring these wonderful kids is structured, fun and unbelievably rewarding. And, if you are not quite ready to make a full time commitment, consider being a substitute. You will still get the training and get to experience the magic at Whiz Kids. Initial Whiz Kids tutor and substitute training will be on Thursday, August 22 with the first day of tutoring on September 5.
