
6-Week Study on John Wesley's Faith



Finance Update

As Crown Heights enters the middle of summer vacation months, I am happy to announce that the church is doing well financially. Through June, we are operating at a profit of almost \$40,000.00! We have also raised over \$9,000.00 by renting unused parts of the building for office space. The rent monies we receive are specifically designated to use for building repairs, which is an ongoing issue with our old building. This year, the Trustees are addressing multiple repairs, including sign repair (\$ 3,900.00), parking lot pothole repair (\$ 2,300.00), HVAC repairs (\$8,000.00), and gutter repair (\$6,000.00). Without the "Future Repairs" Fund and this year's income, it would not be easy for the church to pay these bills.

We are doing a great job of staying within our budget. We are actually under budget on our expenses and are on track to pay 100% of our mandatory apportionments by year's end, if not before.

The Finance Committee would also like to thank the congregation for keeping their pledged and non-pledged gifts up to date. Don't forget that even though you may be out of town on vacation, you can continue to make your pledge payment or contribution through our website. - There is a 2.75% fee for all credit and debit card transactions.
- There is a 1% fee for all transfers of money from personal banking accounts. (To transfer money from your account, we will ask you to fill out a form.)

At Crown Heights, we have built an extensive library of age-appropriate books and educational games. Our experienced tutors and leaders are always on-site to help new tutors. You will find that tutoring these wonderful kids is structured, fun, and unbelievably rewarding. Last year, every one of our Whiz Kids raised their reading testing scores, some significantly. While their dedicated teachers at Wilson deserve most of the credit for those raised scores, we know our safe, structured program every Thursday afternoon with tutors who show kindness, love, and patience with the kids is making a positive difference in the lives of the kids.


