This Fall in worship, we are reading from the Writing Section of the Old Testament. In September, we focused on Esther's courage. She stepped up when it counted, even when the cost was high. For the next two months, we will read Ruth and Job. Ruth shows us what loyalty and love look like when things get tough. And Job... well, Job doesn't shy away from the hard questions. It digs deep into pain, justice, and what it means to trust God when life doesn't make sense. Ruth, Esther, and Job aren't just old stories; they're full of heart, hope, and faith. Each one encourages, challenges, and reminds us of God's faithfulness.

In the Writing Section, some of the books are considered Wisdom Literature. That is a specific genre in the Bible that gives us practical guidance for living a life that honors God. Found in books like Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Job, it teaches us how to navigate everyday situations with integrity, humility, and faith. In Scripture, wisdom means more than just knowing facts—it's about applying God's truth in real-life decisions and relationships.

As we consider our 2026 pledge to this church, we will read Proverbs 3:27: "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act." This verse is a great example of wisdom in action living thoughtfully, generously, and in tune with God's heart. As a church, this is wisdom we want to live by!

Saturdays, 9:30-10:30am in the Youth Activity Building, enter through the Garden Room.


This is an open group that aims to deepen our faith through group discussions. Join us as we take on a topic and hear each person's experience, wisdom, or uncertainties on that topic.

Finance Update

In 2029, the original part of our church building will be 100 years old. While having an old church offers beauty and character, we've come to learn that it comes with a price tag too. Maintaining our property is always a concern, and this summer our Trustees have been busy making hard decisions on **repairs and maintenance** for our old building. The Finance Committee wants the church to know about the large recent expenses that affect all of us. Please see page 5 to see the specific repairs made.

The total repair and maintenance for these items totals \$52,000.00. The Trustees' annual budget for building repair and maintenance is only \$8,000. All office rents received are also designated for these items, but even with those, the church will have to pull significantly more from our reserves.

Any extra help with our expensive summer would be appreciated. If you are willing and able to help, please label your gift "Building." Thank you for your consideration.

Fortunately, the church had been doing unusually well financially until these unanticipated issues arose. As of now, our church has paid almost \$20,000 of our **Conference Apportionments** of \$28,280. The Finance Committee had hoped to pay off its Conference Apportionments in the Fall so that this year's Christmas offering could be dedicated to a special mission involving an eviction prevention program that Neighborhood Services Organization runs called "**Stay Housed**." The program is designed to help tenants understand the eviction process, connect them with vital resources and help Oklahomans stay in their homes. The Finance Committee is keeping an eye on all these worthy commitments as we finish out the year.

In other church financial topics, **Nancy Anthony** has recently been named the new chair for the Conference Finance and Administration. Her skills will be used well. Meanwhile, **Bob Anthony** is now serving on the Conference's Equitable Compensation Committee, which makes decisions on how to fairly pay clergy around the Conference. Our church pays an apportioned amount of \$406 to be distributed by this Committee to clergy valued higher than their apportionment can pay. Thanks to Nancy and Bob for your work and for doing a great job representing Crown Heights UMC!

Our Expensive Summer









The Fellowship Hall part of our building was built in 1929, the Sanctuary was built in 1941, and the Youth Activity side was built in 1965. So clearly, maintaining our property is always a concern. Our Trustee chair Jim Rust (and his team, Marie and Van) guides us with hard decisions on repairs and maintenance. We wanted the church to know about the big expenses that came in this summer, affecting all of us.

This summer 5 of our 16 HVAC units needed maintenance. We also replaced 2 control panels for safety and efficiency. TOTAL \$25K We replaced part of our sewer line, running from the Fellowship Hall porch to the main line. TOTAL \$15K Because of water in our basement, we are having our drains and downspouts reworked to keep water away from the building. TOTAL \$6K Our sign was damaged by vandalism and weather. This repair was delayed because of materials but was recently completed. TOTAL \$4K We worked on 3 fences for a TOTAL of \$2K.

> That is \$52K of bills. We budget \$8K and designate all office rental income for maintaining the building. We were prepared for \$35K before pulling from reserves. Any extra help with our expensive summer would be appreciated. Please label your gift "Building."

This might be a good time to mention, many members of our church have volunteered their time and energy to work on our yard or on our property. Every act, big or small, is appreciated by our church. It takes a village!

Arts Academy


